




#### **US PHYSICIANS BY CATEGORY**




#### **DIRECT PATIENT CARE PHYSICIANS** (INCLUDING RESIDENTS) BY AGE





## **NATIONAL RESIDENT MATCHING PROGRAM**




93% of 19,866 Matched to a PGY-1 residency position
